As the morning sun cleaveth the eastern mist, Boaz descendeth upon the outer gates of Dunedin, where the company summoneth a chariot of iron to carry them into the wild borderlands.

9:30 AM — The Great West Drive North

They turn their faces toward the shadow of the mountains, tracking the great northern road past the old keeps to meet the rugged paths of the mountain kings.

- **Tyndrum:** A mid-morning halt at the famed Green Welly outpost, where the fellowship may gather hot pies, road provisions, and such humble talismans as coffee and crisps before the wild country closes in.
- **Rannoch Moor Overlook:** A crossing of the great silent moss-lands, where dark pools and ancient peat lie beneath the gaze of distant massifs, and the road runs like a lone thread through the empty places of the world.
- **Pass of Glencoe:** A slow passage through the colossal volcanic cleft, beneath the towering walls of the Three Sisters, where black crags, falling waters, and old clan memories brood over the path.
- **Lunch at Spean Bridge:** A welcome respite at the Lochside Brasserie, where the weary travelers may take meat, bread, and strong drink beside the waters before the final road bends toward Glen Shiel.

At the setting of the sun, they cross into the deep sanctuary of Glen Shiel, making camp beneath the towering watch of the Five Sisters.

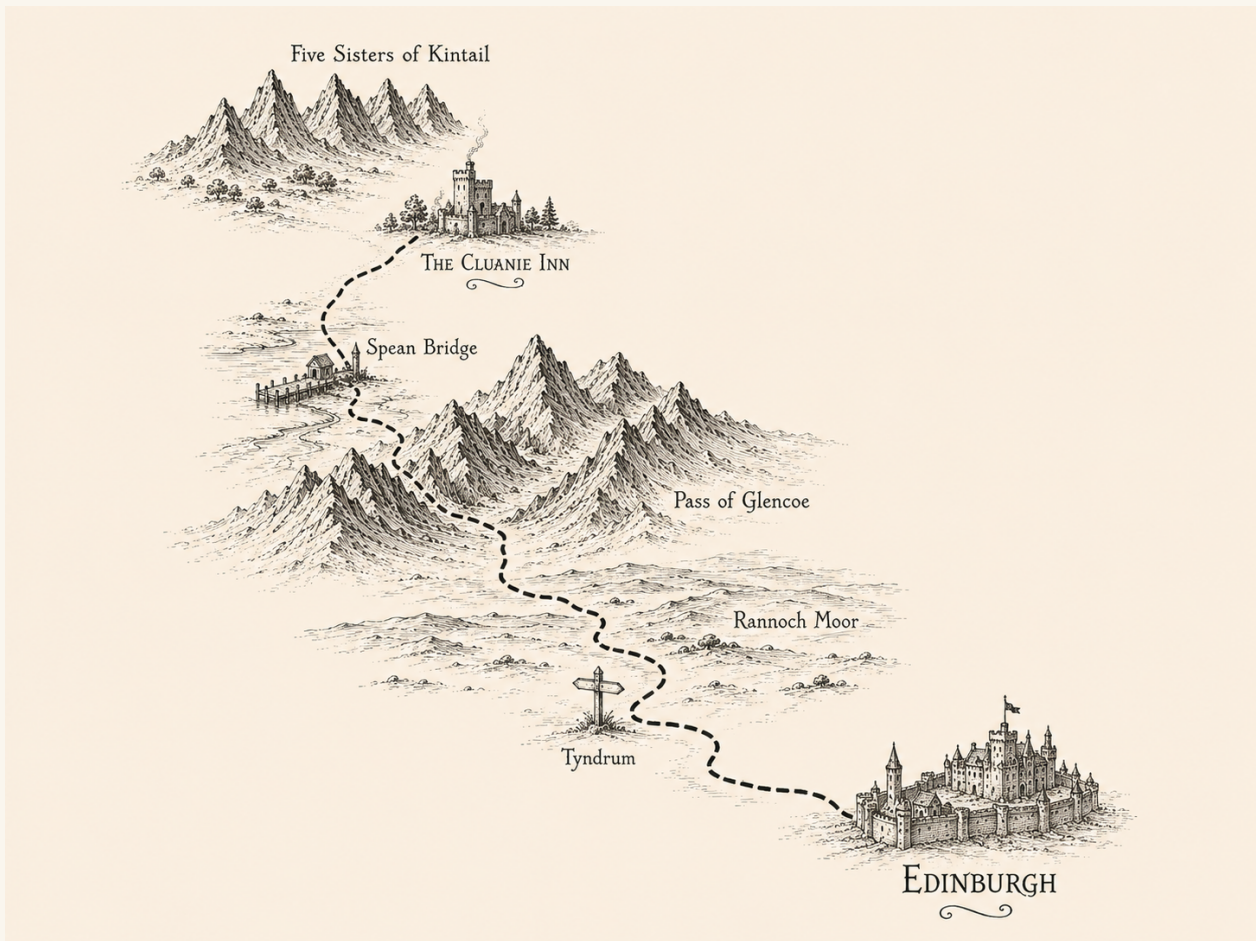

The Road into the Wild



Behold the road that leadeth into the North, a winding track into the heart of the wild hills where the stone-towers of Dunedin are left behind. The fellowship turneth their faces toward the shadow of the mountains, passing from the settled streets of the Lowlands into country of older names: Stirling's watchful crag, the green folds near Loch Lomond and the Trossachs, and the long rising roads where sheep regard all travelers with the cold judgment of ancient kings. Through Crianlarich and into the rocky walls of Tyndrum they press, pausing at the Green Welly Stop for quick rations, hot pies, and such humble artifacts as crisps, coffee, and petrol, without which even the bravest company may grow mutinous before noon.

Beyond Tyndrum the land openeth and darkeneth. The road bends toward Bridge of Orchy and the wide loneliness of Rannoch Moor, a great desolation of ancient peat, silver water, and wind-scoured silence, where pools lie black beneath the sky and distant massifs keep watch over the empty places of the world. Here the company should look for the first true signs that the North has claimed them: the road running like a thin grey thread across the moor, clouds dragging their cloaks over the high shoulders of the hills, and the sudden sense that ordinary maps have become mere suggestions. If the heavens pour rain, take it as a blessing from the old powers, though the driver may call it by a less poetic name.

Thence the road plunges toward Glencoe, where Buachaille Etive Mor rises at the gate like a dark sentinel and the glen opens into a colossal chasm of black stone, green slope, and brooding volcanic crag. The vertical walls of the Three Sisters tower above the path like stone giants, their ridges cut by shadow and weather; while waterfalls trace pale lines down the rock after rain. Slowly the iron chariot tracks the winding pass beneath heights that have seen the passing of clans, redcoats, drovers, and countless damp tourists wrapped in inappropriate jackets. The wind speaketh there in tongues of old wars and older griefs, and even the least sentimental traveler may find himself staring upward in silence, unless distracted by the urgent search for a decent sandwich.

Leaving the high pass, the path turns by Ballachulish and the grey waters of Loch Linnhe, then northward toward Fort William, where Ben Nevis lifts its cloud-crowned head above the Great Glen. Past Spean Bridge and the memorial heights, the company draws near to Loch Lochy and the long chain of waters that cleave the Highlands like a blade. At last the road turns west into Glen Shiel, where the mountains gather close, the light grows solemn, and the Five Sisters of Kintail rise like an unbroken wall of shields against the outer world. Beneath their towering watch, where mist clings to heather and the modern world is politely asked to wait outside, the lonely haven of the Cluanie Inn stands ready, its hearth-fires lit against the mountain chill and its beds promising peace to all who have endured the noble trial of sitting in a car for many hours.

TUESDAY, JULY 7 & WEDNESDAY, JULY 8

Black Sheep Adventures — Canyon River Rafting Safari & Highland Pursuits

A gentle voyage upon the waters of the River Oich, drifting through deep canyon walls into the wide expanse of the Great Mere of Loch Ness, requiring no great labor of body or shield-arm. Other paths may also be summoned from the Black Sheep host: fishing upon Highland waters, boating, bespoke adventures, self-guided walks, and such noble trials as archery or clay pigeon shooting for those who wish to prove their worth without falling into a river.

Nevis Range — Mountain Gondola Excursion

Ascending via enclosed moving cages unto the high ridges of Aonach Mòr at two thousand and two hundred feet, where level stone boardwalks open to panoramic vistas stretching out unto the Western Isles.

Eilean Donan Castle

An expedition to the storied thirteenth-century island stronghold rising from the dark waters, approached by a smooth, flat stone bridge granting easy passage into the great banqueting halls of old.

Lochcarron Golf Club

A scenic nine-hole quest west of Glen Shiel, set beside Loch Carron, where the company may discover whether ancient knees and modern handicaps can survive the wind, the views, and the judgment of the local sheep.

Nightcap — Stargazing & Rare Malts

A gathering upon the unlit mountain pass terrace under a vault of stars, where the company uncorks rare single malts to toast the shadows of the glens.

THURSDAY, JULY 9 — THE EAST COAST A9 LOOP

They break camp at the Cluanie Inn to track eastward through Inverness, turning south along the sweeping heather plateaus of the A9 pass, pausing above the wooded gorge of Killiecrankie for coffee, patisserie, and one last breath of Highland Perthshire before the city draws them back.

- **Inverness:** Passage through the Highland capital where the River Ness bends toward the firth and the road turns south.

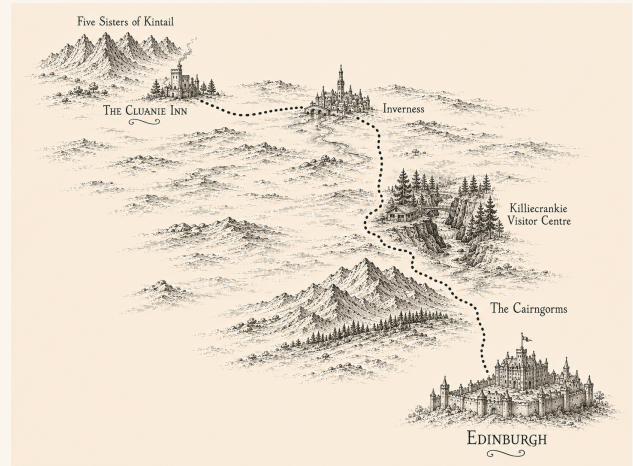
- **Cairngorms National Park:** A long sweep through broad mountain country, pine forests, and open moorland beneath the eastern Highlands.

- **Killiecrankie Visitor Centre:** Mid-route halt above the wooded gorge of the River Garry, with cafe, patisserie, Scottish history, and enough scenery to make even weary travelers briefly dignified.

- **Pitlochry & Perthshire:** Rolling wooded hills

and old market towns marking the slow return from wild glens to Lowland roads.

- **Forth Crossings:** Final approach toward Edinburgh across the bridges and waterways guarding the city from the north.

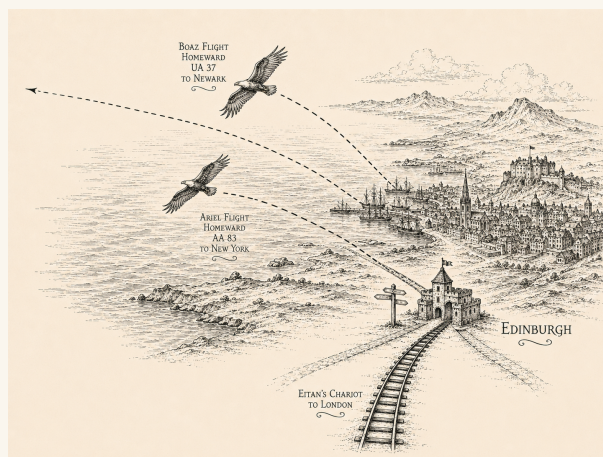

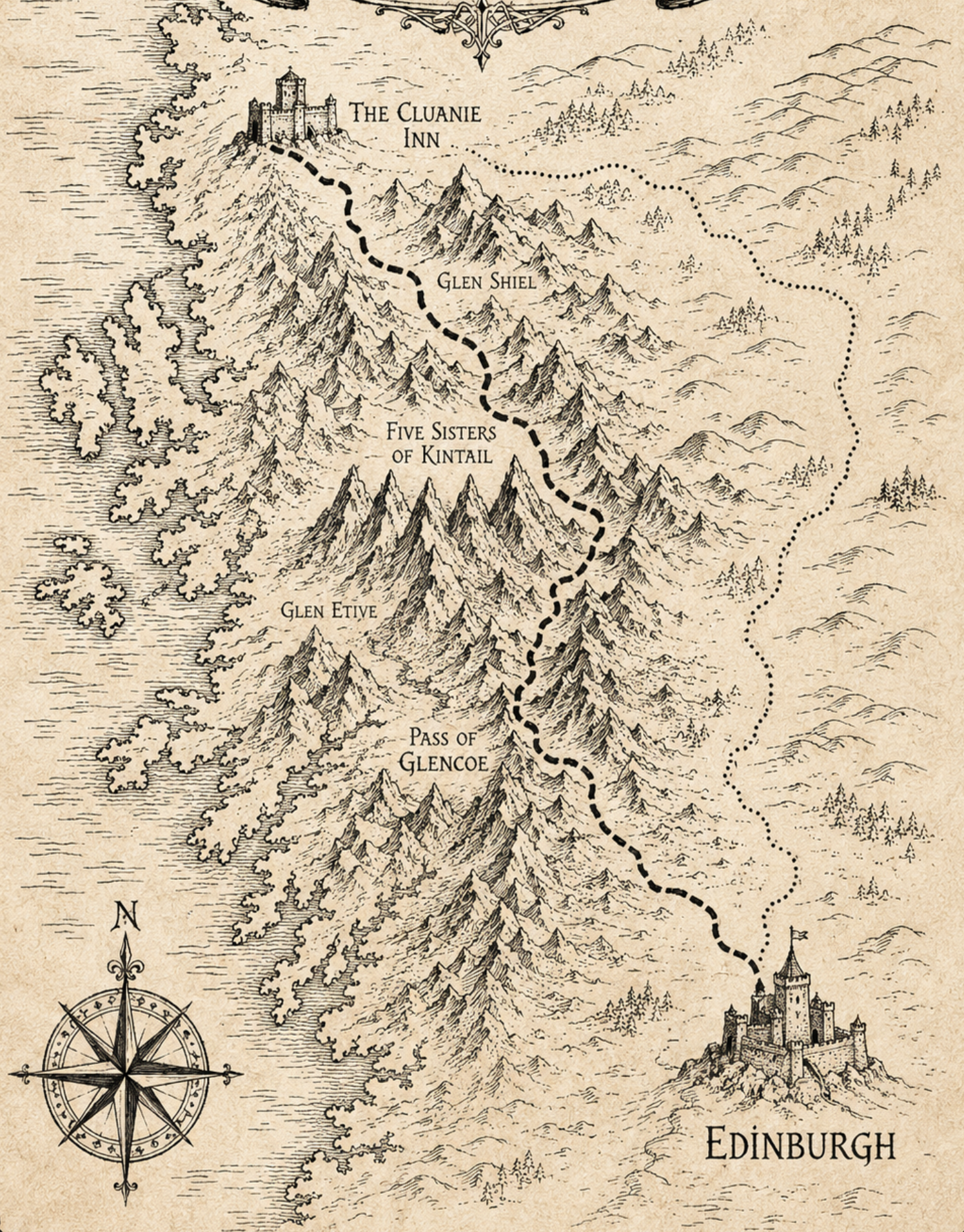
